## Gender Audit Report

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## **1. Preamble**

Gender equality is important for the growth of stake holders of an institution. Gender audit is a process and a tool to critically examine capacity of an educational institution to provide safe and secure ambience for girl students, teaching and non-teaching female staff for gender parity. Critical assessment through participation of stakeholders, helps identify strengths and gaps in gender equality. The assessment provides direction to improve gender equity.

## **2. Brief profile of Swami Shraddhanand College**

Swami Shraddhanand College, a constituent College of Delhi University, is run under the trusteeship of Delhi Govt. From a humble beginning in 1967 at Gandhi Ashram in Narela, to its present location in Alipur, SSNC has made great strides to become a popular co-educational college for all the streams of undergraduate courses and some post graduate courses. The College named after a great Indian educationist and social reformer Swami Shraddhanand Ji, imparts quality higher education through technological advancements and changing pedagogy, and believes in educational philosophy to promote education for all. It is dedicated to focus on the holistic development through impartial, inclusive and learner-centric approach. The College is equipped with qualified teaching staff, specialized laboratories and adequate library facilities.

The student societies / associations play a vital role in improving the academic environs of the college. 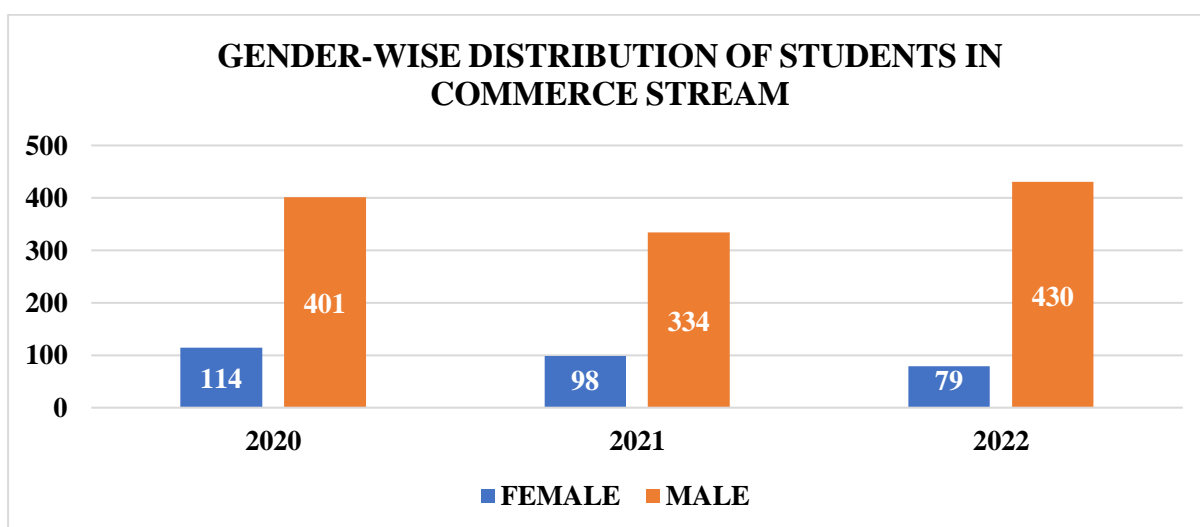
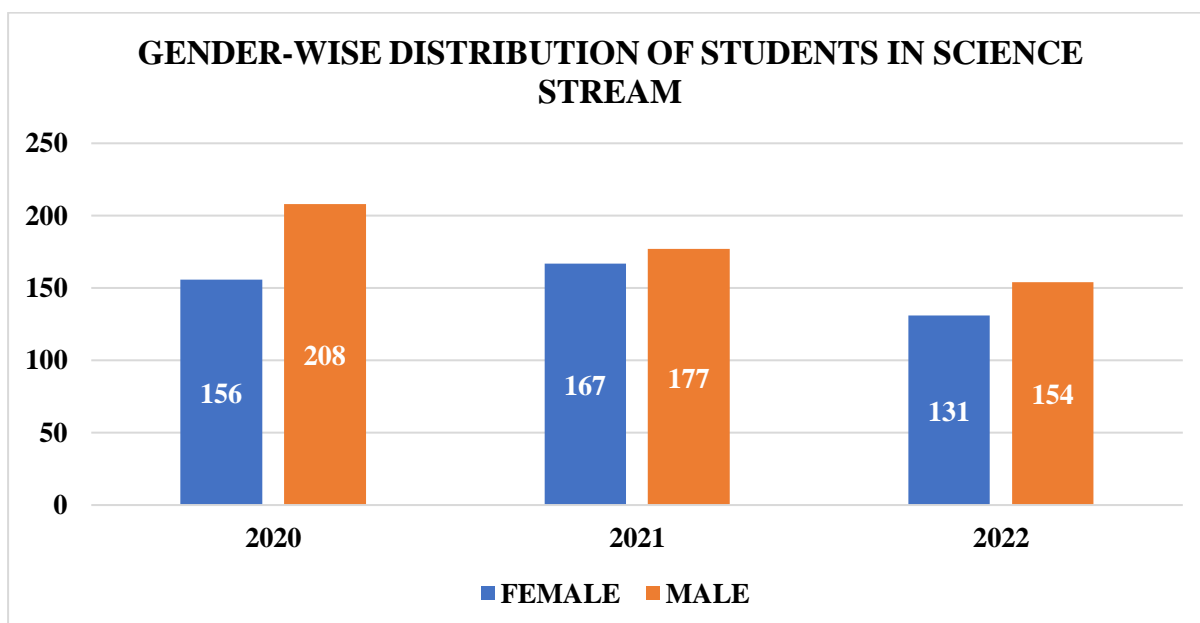

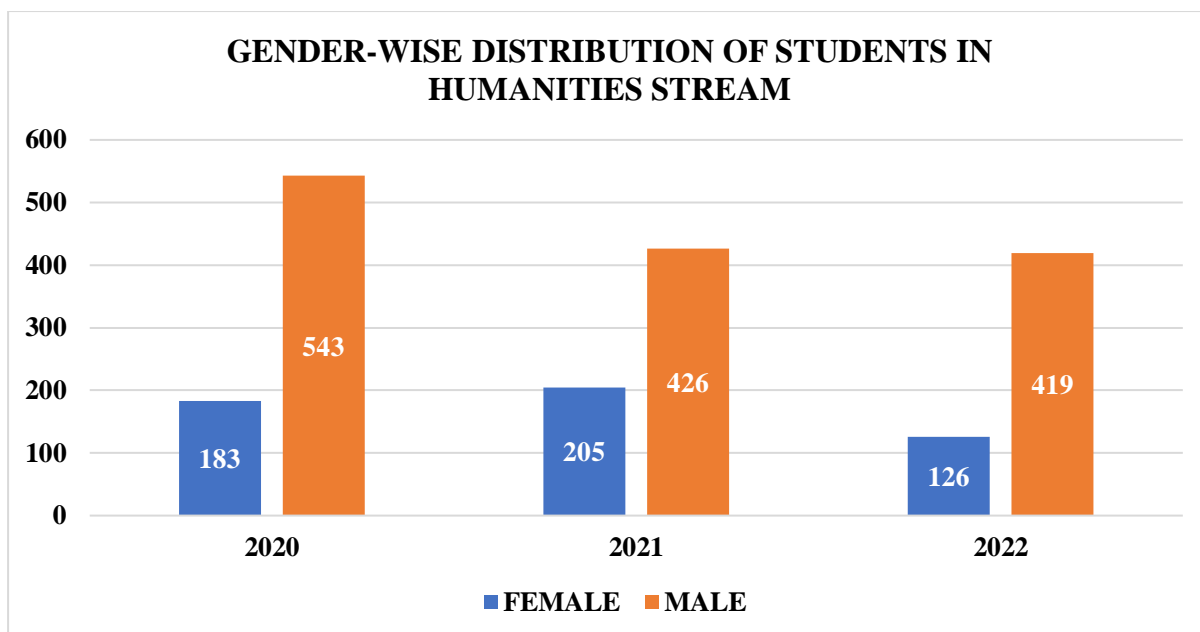
### 3. The Audit:

#### A. Gender-wise Representation Students (All Courses):

Gender wise analysis of data in all the courses in the last three years represents that there has been consistent (30%) representation of female students. The consistent enrolment of female students suggests safe and protective environment for girls in the campus.





Further, the gender wise distribution of female students in all the three streams has been analysed. The data suggests that the girl students have an almost equal representation in science stream and it has been consistent through the last three years. In commerce and humanities, the ratio of female students is much less than that of boys. The data represents the preference of students to SSNC in addition to the college campuses for the science subjects.

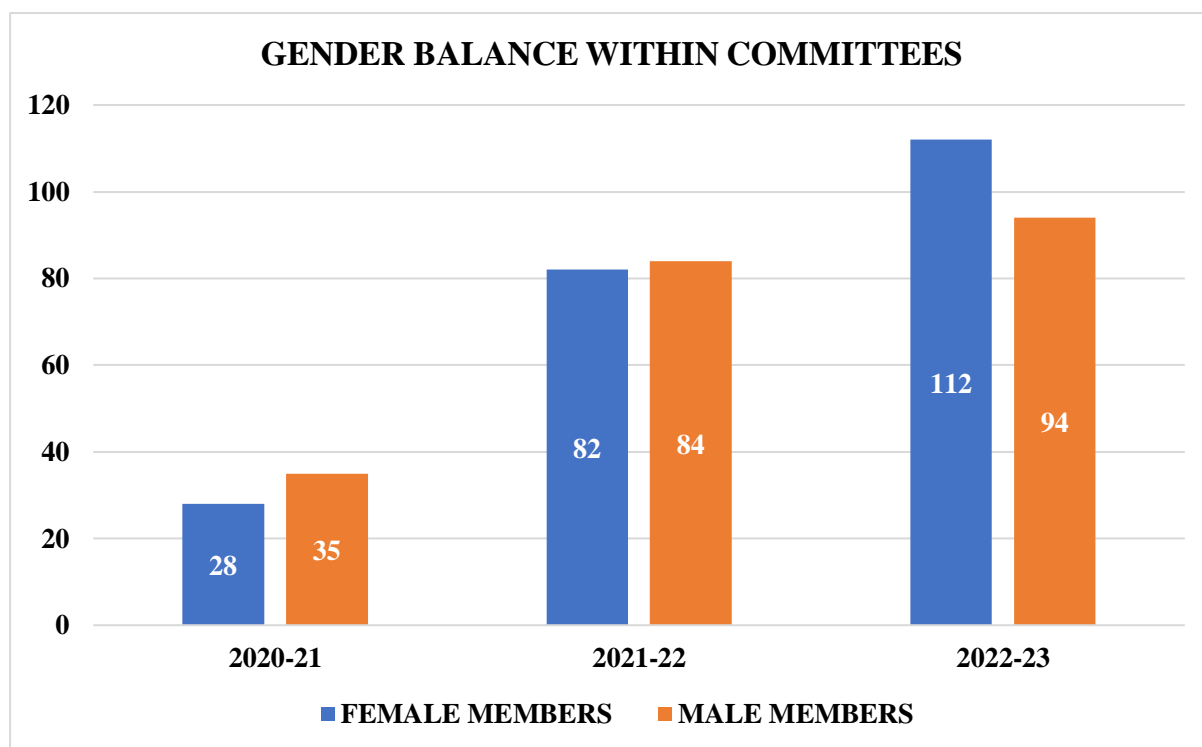

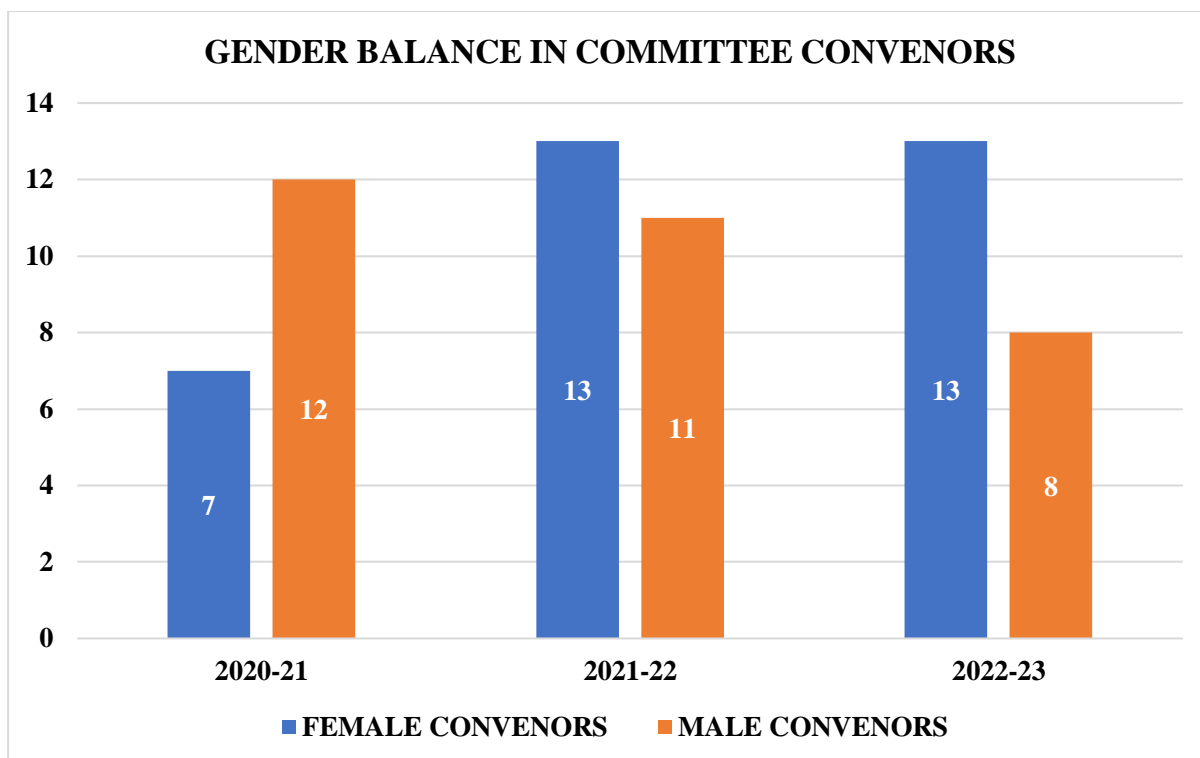

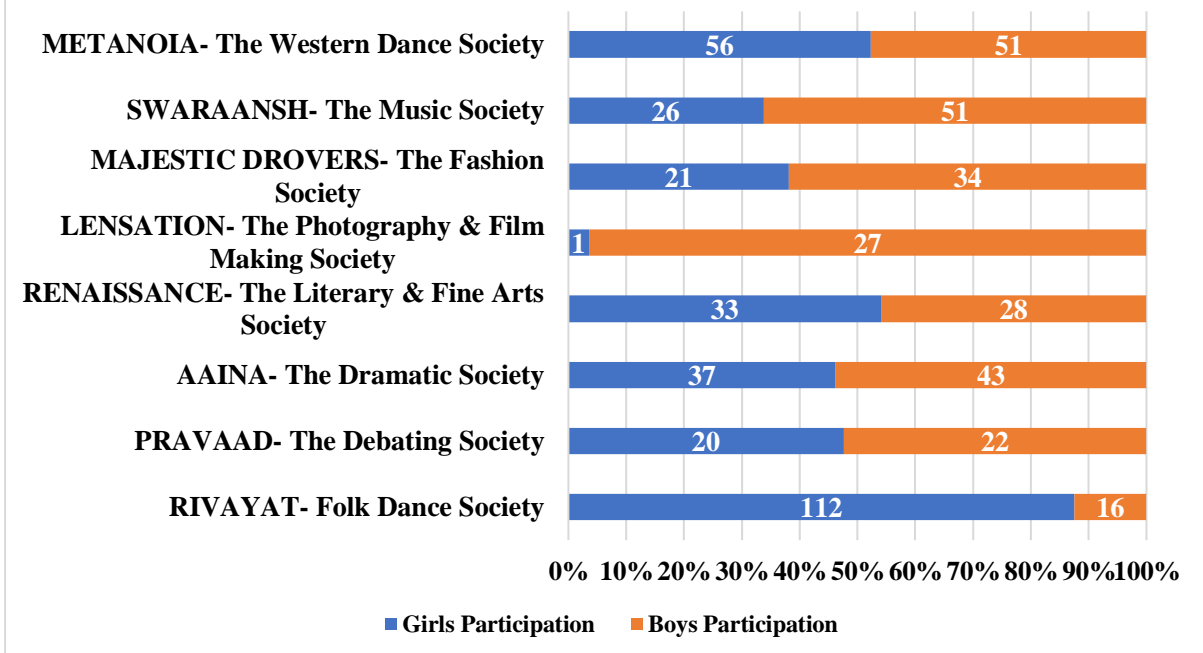

#### **5. Gender Sensitization**

Gender sensitization is a continuous process which is taken care of through various activities round the session. Women Development Cell is very active in promoting gender equality and the cause of gender sensitization. There are academic and extra-curricular activities for the same. Apart from WDC, Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) is keenly associated with the interest of women welfare and safety of girls in the college campus. The committee creates awareness programs for gender sensitization and against sexual harassment. Proctorial Board and Anti-Ragging committees also take care and address cases of misconduct/misbehaviour and any type of grievances. Grievance redressal committee for admission and exam related issues.

### A. Women Development Cell and other societies:

Women Development Cell [Link](#) is committed to the cause of gender sensitization and to promote gender equality. It is worthwhile to mention that both boys and girls are encouraged to participate in gender sensitization. Seminars, talks, camps are held regularly to empower girl students as well as to sensitize students. Every Year WDC organizes Diwali Mela aptly named as “Roshni” to encourage women entrepreneurs. This also helps to endorse ‘Vocal for Local’ motto, a need of today’s India by promoting local craftsmanship such as handmade diyas, dresses, decorative items etc. Various programs carried out by ICC have been listed in the Healthy Practices below.

### B. Internal Complaint Committee (ICC)

The Committee Against Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, Redressal) Act, 2013 is enacted to ensure safe working place for women and to build enabling work environment that respects women’s right to safety and equal opportunity. All workspaces in India are mandated by law to provide safe and secure working environment free from sexual harassment for women. University Grants Commission (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of Women Employees and Students in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2015.

The working of college’s ICC has been to focus on bringing awareness and sensitizing the issue of the gender equality among students. For this, the awareness programs among students of 1<sup>st</sup> year on “The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act- The POSH Act” have been regularly carried out. The aim is also to spread awareness among the students regarding available support system to them in the form of Internal Complaints Committee by proper display at various display boards and at college website. The Internal complaint committee, ICC, of the college caters to any complaint, reported in this respect, responsibly and addresses the grievances in respect of harassment at workplace in a time bound manner. The various programs carried out by ICC, SSNC have been listed in the Healthy Practices below.

### C. NCC and sports:

NCC is a very important activity. It provides students an opportunity to shoulder the responsibility of Nation building. The Army and Navy wings of NCC for girls were established in October 2000. Our cadets take part in camps and cultural activities organised by NCC to add to their skills on regular basis. Our cadet Seema Maan had been selected to attend the Republic Day Parade. 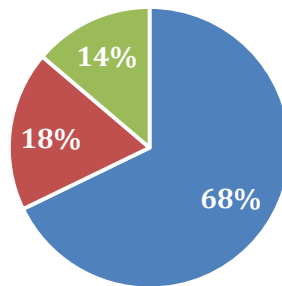

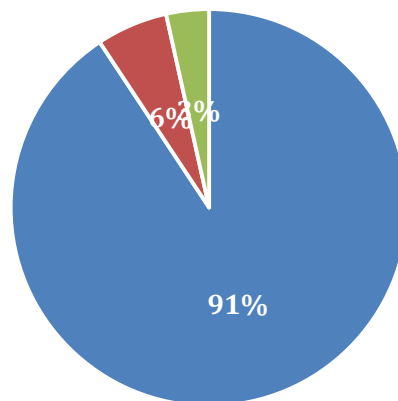

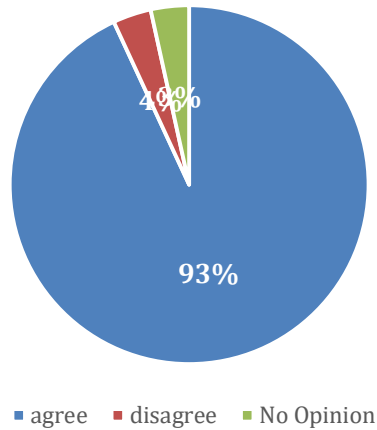

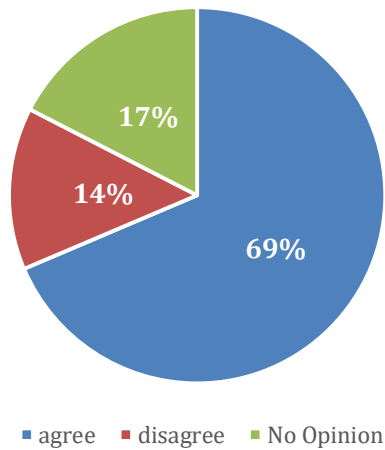

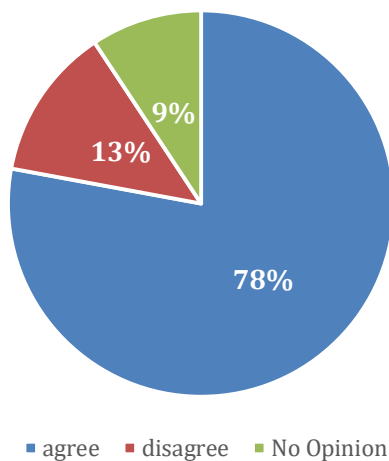

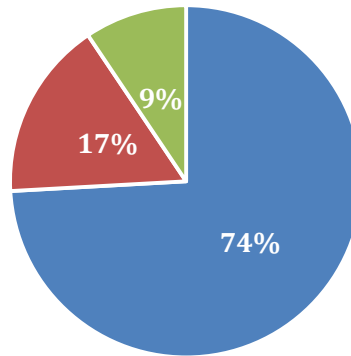

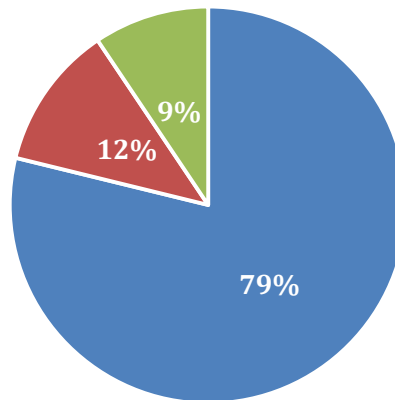


**Attitude of laboratory staff is appropriate.**



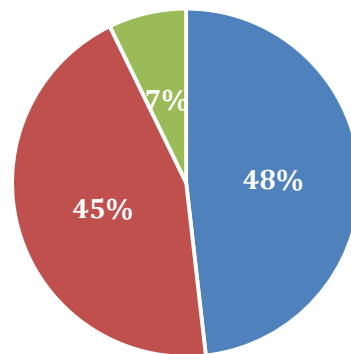

**Timing of the laboratory is appropriate**



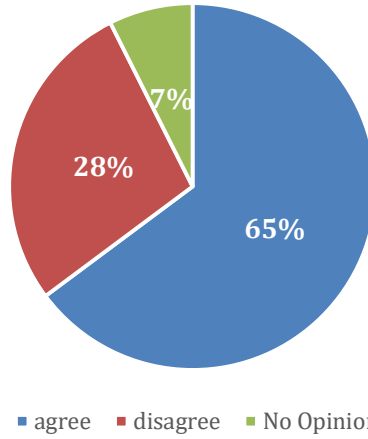

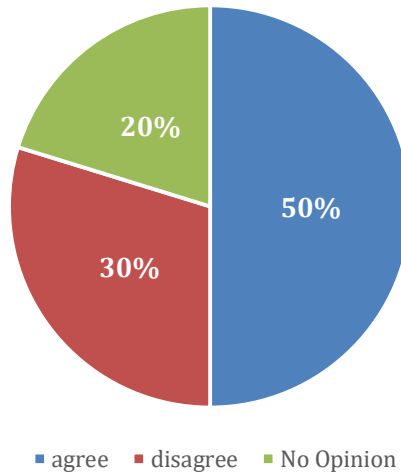

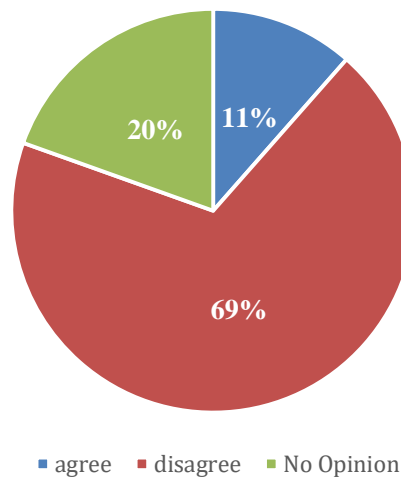

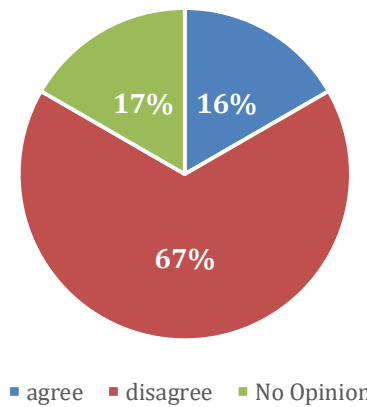

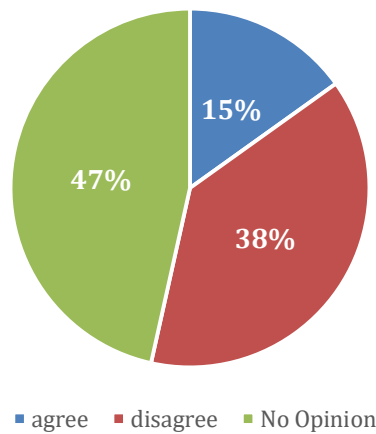
**Have you been a victim of sexual harassment at class by faculties?**



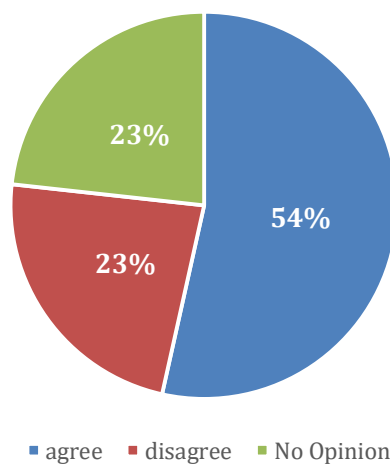
**Have you been a victim of sexual harassment at class by fellow students?**



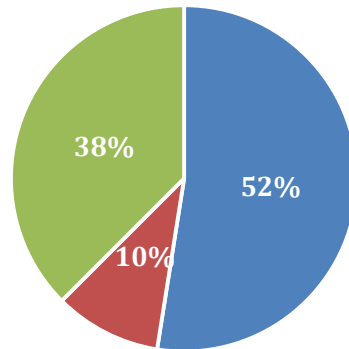

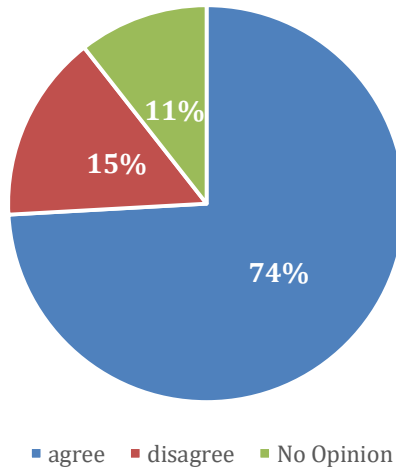

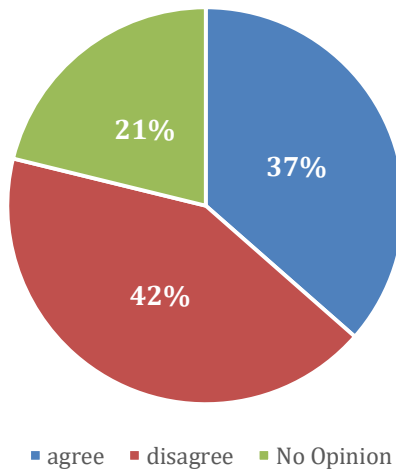
**Are you conscious about how to deal with cybercrimes?**



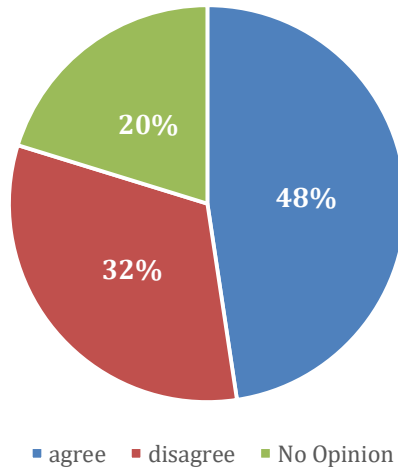

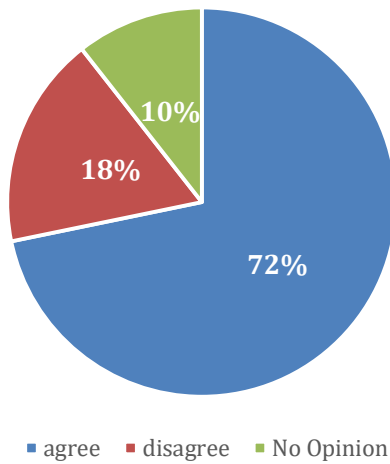
**Is there a separate queue for girls during hall, office etc.**



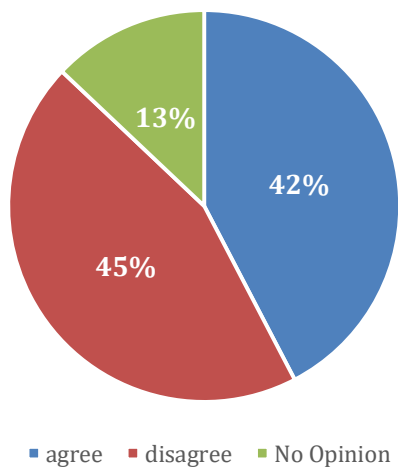
**Do you feel separate queue is required?**

### Recommendations:

1. It has been observed that many female students are yet unaware of **Himmat App**, a need of awareness programs for the same is recommended.
2. Primary health care facilities need to be improved and should be made available during the college hours.
3. Female students have expressed a requirement of girl's hostel. The recommendations for the same has been strongly made.
4. Requirement of safe transport for the female students has been expressed. Measures may be taken to improve and arrange the same.
5. Practice of separate queue at the office and library is also suggested.
6. Gender Sensitization Programmes for security personnel were recommended.
7. Though the college offers facilities for participation of girl students in sports activities, number of girls in sports is less. The institution has very good boys' teams of Kabbaddi, Cricket, and Football. It is suggested to make girl students' teams to represent college in sports at University, National and International level to bring gender parity.
8. Although self defence events, activities, workshops for girls were organized in last two years. It should be a continuous practice and should be mentioned in college calendar.


