Originally located at Gandhi Ashram, Narela, the institution now operates from two adjacent, eco-conscious, Wi-Fi-enabled campuses in Alipur, North Delhi, serving more than 4,000 students.

DISCIPLINARY CONTROL AND ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

Discipline

Swami Shraddhanand College is committed to maintaining a disciplined, safe, and conducive environment for academic growth. The Proctorial Board and Anti-Ragging Committees play pivotal roles in upholding discipline and ensuring student welfare. These bodies address student grievances and have the authority to adjudicate matters involving breaches of discipline. Students are expected to comply with college rules and regulations. The following behaviours are considered disciplinary infractions:

1. Neglecting assigned tasks and class work.
2. Disrupting classes and causing disturbances.
3. Showing defiance towards teachers or other college authorities.
4. Misconduct within the classroom, including damage to furniture or college property.
5. Inciting others to engage in disruptive or disorderly activities.
6. Shouting and loitering on college premises.
7. Leaving classes without permission.
8. Smoking or drinking within the college premises.
9. Diverting college buses from their designated routes is a serious offence and may lead to strict disciplinary action, including expulsion.
10. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited as per the University of Delhi Ordinance XV-C, which states:

Ragging is strictly banned within the college, the university system, and on public transport.

Any individual or collective act of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and will be dealt with severe punitive measures.

Ragging includes:

- o Physical assault, threats, or the use of force.
- o Violating the dignity and honour of women students.
- o Violating the dignity of students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Tribes.
- o Acts that expose students to ridicule, contempt, or harm their self-esteem.
- o Verbal abuse, indecent gestures, or obscene behaviour.

The college functions from 8:30 a.m. till 5:30 p.m., and each academic period lasts 60 minutes.

Department of Botany

National Education Policy (NEP) 2020

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 marks a significant shift in India's educational landscape, aiming to create a learner-centered framework that empowers students with the knowledge, skills, and values required to meet the challenges of a rapidly evolving world. Recognizing the crucial role of education in national development, NEP 2020 envisions a holistic, flexible, and multidisciplinary approach to teaching and learning. It emphasizes critical thinking, conceptual clarity, ethical reasoning, and experiential learning. The policy seeks to ensure inclusive and equitable quality education for all while nurturing a deep sense of responsibility towards the nation. It focuses on achieving academic excellence by integrating equity and efficiency in higher education, thereby preparing learners to become competent, responsible citizens of the 21st century.

At the undergraduate level, NEP 2020 introduces a four-year multidisciplinary programme that offers multiple entry and exit options. Students may exit after one year with a certificate (upon earning 48 credits), after two years with a diploma (96 credits), after three years with a bachelor's degree (140 credits), or complete the full four years to earn an honours or research degree (180 credits). This structure supports academic mobility and flexibility while promoting depth in chosen disciplines. The curriculum encourages active student engagement through a credit-based system designed to allow smooth academic progression.

The fourth year of the undergraduate programme is particularly significant as it integrates research-based learning aligned with the student's discipline. Departments and faculty play a crucial role in linking research activities to the taught curriculum, ensuring that these experiences are meaningful, skill-enhancing, and academically enriching. Supported by modern laboratories, a well-established Central Research Facility, and research-oriented faculty, students are guided through hands-on projects, fieldwork, and scientific inquiry, laying a strong foundation for future academic or professional research.

Key features of NEP 2020 at the undergraduate level include the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) for credit transfer and accumulation, interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary learning, integration of skill development and value-based education, and a multi-exit framework. These reforms are designed to enhance the quality and relevance of higher education in India while fostering lifelong learning and innovation.

1. 22.5% of the total number of seats is reserved for Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Caste and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes, interchangeable if necessary).
2. The Candidate must have a caste/Tribe certificate in their name at the time of Registration and Admission. The Caste certificate should clearly state:
 - Name of his/ her caste/ tribe
 - Whether the candidate belongs to SC or ST
 - District and the State or Union Territory of the Candidate's usual place of residence, and
 - The appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his/ her caste/ tribe is approved as SC or ST.

3. Candidates will have to produce a valid original SC or ST caste/tribe certificate at the time of admission. The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC/ST Certificate:

- District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/ Addl. Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/ 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate/Sub-divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
- Revenue Officer, not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the Candidate and/ or his family normally resides.
- Administrator/ Secretary to the Administrator/ Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes (OBC, Non-Creamy Layer, Central List)

1. 27% seats are reserved for Candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC- Non-Creamy Layer, Central List).
2. At the time of giving admission to an OBC Candidate, the College will ensure that the caste is included in the Central List of OBC (the OBC status is to be determined based on the Central (Govt. of India)). List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes (available at the website http://ncbc.nic.in/backward_classes/index.html)
3. The certificate must mention the non-creamy layer status of the Candidate (Non-creamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DOPT Office Memorandum no. 36012/22/93- Estt. (SCT) dated 15.11.1993).
4. The OBC Candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the candidate as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res- I) dated 31 March 2016). The certificate should be issued after 31st March, 2026.

Reservation policy for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)

- As per the University of Delhi notifications (Reference No. Aca. I/ Reservation of EWSs/ 2019/ 63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I/ Reservation of EWSs / 2019/ 101 Dated 15th May 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the University Departments/ Centres/ Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission of candidates belonging to the EWS category.
- The certificate should be issued after 31st March, 2026.

Admission to Supernumerary Seats

Admission to all supernumerary seats will be through CUET (UG) 2026. Candidates desirous of taking admission on Supernumerary seats must appear in CUET (UG) 2026.

A. Reservation of Seats for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)

- Five percent (5%) of the total sanctioned strength in each Program is reserved for PwBD candidates.
- Separate Allocation result/s will be declared for candidates seeking admission under the PwBD quota.

Disability Certificates issued after 01.06.2021 must be as per the Gazette Notification No. 1736 (E) dated 05.05.2021 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and applied through the UDID portal. However, Disability Certificates issued before 01.06.2021 will be considered as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and the University of Delhi.

Concessional/Waiver of fees in respect of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)

- Candidates with physical disabilities pursuing various programs of study shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees, except the Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University students 'Union, and Identity Card fee (As per amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University).
- PwBD Candidates who meet the merit for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for PwBD candidates.

B- Reservation for Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW)

- Five percent (5%) of seats are reserved for Candidates under this category, program-wise. Candidates desirous of taking admission under the CW quota of the University must appear in CUET 2026.
- All such Candidates have to upload the Educational Concession Certificate (ECC) issued by any of the following authorities on the proper letter head: Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi; Secretary, Rajya Zila Sainik Board; Officer-in-Charge, Record Office; 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate; Ministry of Home Affairs (For Police Personnel in receipt of Gallantry Awards)
- No other format shall be permissible. Proofs of the CW category in the form of an ID card of parent or dependent, Medical card, Ration card, CSD card, etc., are not admissible instead of a certificate in the correct format. The priority must be mentioned in the certificate. Certificates that do not mention the relevant priority will not be considered.

C- Reservation of Kashmiri Migrants (KM)

- Up to 5% seats are reserved program-wise for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants.
- All the wards of Kashmiri Migrants will have to upload a certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by the Divisional Commissioner/Relief Commissioner.
- Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Kashmiri Migrants quota must appear in CUET (UG) - 2026.

D- Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students must appear in CUET 2026.

E- Ward Quota of Employees of the University of Delhi

- Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Ward Quota of Employees of the University of Delhi must appear in CUET 2026.

F- Orphans Quota (OQ)

- Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary Quota for Orphans must appear in CUET (UG) - 2026.
- The University of Delhi will be admitting two candidates (one male and one female) in each program of study. These two seats will be supernumerary.
- A candidate who wishes to seek admission under the orphan's quota must possess a certificate from a Govt. recognized Orphanage/Charitable Home or a Death certificate of both parents.
- As per University Notification No. Acad. I/Orphan Quota/2024-25/10 dated 16th January 2024 - Candidates seeking admission with effect from the Academic Session 2024-25 onwards under the Orphan Quota shall pay the following fees:-
 - Admission Fee - Rs. 10.00
 - Examination Fee - Rs. 10.00

G- Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) and Sports Quota

- Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary quota for ECA and/or Sports must appear in CUET 2026.
- For admissions to ECA and Sports supernumerary seats, a weightage of 25% will be given to CUET score and 75% to certificates/trials/performances.

H- Single Girl Child Quota (SGC)

- 01 (One) seat in each Program of every college is reserved under the Supernumerary Quota for a single girl child.
- The parent or guardian (if parents are deceased) must declare that the girl child is the only child and that there is no other male or female child in the family. This declaration is required for admission under the "Single Girl Child" category for the academic session 2026-27.
- A copy of an affidavit confirming this must be uploaded during online registration.

- The original affidavit must be produced at the time of physical document verification.

Financial assistance/scholarship to students

Students Aid Fund

The objective of this fund is to render financial assistance to deserving students to enable them to deposit their tuition/ examination fees or to purchase books. It also runs a Book Bank having 10,000 books which are lent to the students on loan.

Fee Concession and Prizes

- Fee concession is given to a few students on the basis of merit and individual needs.
- Students belonging to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes are awarded scholarships by the Ministry of Education. Such students are required to apply to “The Secretary, Scheduled Castes/Tribes and the Backward Classes Board, Govt. of India” on prescribed form, through the principal, immediately after joining the college.
- Prizes are given to students for academic distinction in University Examinations and for distinguished performance in debates and other cultural activities. College sports colours are awarded to sportsmen winning distinction at inter-college meets.

PM-Vidyalaxmi

An initiative under the Pradhan Mantri Vidya Lakshmi Karyakram, aimed at empowering students with financial support for higher education. This national portal offers a single-window platform for students to access information about education loans, apply to multiple banks, and track their applications seamlessly. For undergraduate students at the University of Delhi, PM-VidyaLaxmi provides a valuable opportunity to pursue academic aspirations without financial constraints, promoting inclusive and equitable access to quality education.

Internal Assessment

It will be based on Class test, assignment & attendance. At least 67% attendance is compulsory for appearing in theory exams.

Identity Card

Every student will be issued an Identity Card. The students are required to keep their Identity Cards and produce the same on demand. Students will have to deposit the Identity Card to the college office while claiming back their securities. In case of loss of Identity Card, the students shall have to deposit Rs.100, and produce a copy of the FIR from the concerned Police Station and also submit an affidavit to this effect for getting a duplicate Identity Card issued.

Refund of Security Deposit

Security deposits are refundable, but payment will be made only on application and after deduction of outstanding dues, if any. If no application is received from a student within three years of leaving the college, the amount shall lapse to the College account.

INFRASTRUCTURE



Library

The college library serves as a vital academic resource, fully automated with LIMS and operating on SOUL 3.0 software. It houses a vast collection of over 1,13,647 books, including textbooks, reference materials, general reading, periodicals, and a dedicated Braille section to support inclusive education. The library subscribes to 27 newspapers (with multiple copies) and 24 magazines to keep the academic community well-informed. Users are issued barcoded identity cards for efficient circulation, with borrowing privileges based on user category, and daily usage is recorded through an entrance logbook.

A web-based Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) enables easy and remote access to resources. Through the INFLIBNET N-LIST Consortium and the Delhi University Library System (DULS), students and faculty can access more than 2 lakh e-books and over 6,000 e-journals. Facilities for visually challenged users include assistive technologies and an extensive Braille collection, with future plans to upgrade to RFID-based systems. Library services span both campuses and include reading rooms, circulation and inter-library loan services, reference and referral support, and a dedicated help desk. The library also maintains subscriptions to key digital platforms such as e-Shodh Sindhu, e-Shodh Ganga, e-databases, e-journals, and e-books, all of which are accessible remotely. A display board in the reading area highlights the latest arrivals to keep users updated with new additions.

The college houses a dedicated and well-equipped Examination Branch designed to support the efficient management of academic records and assessment-related activities. Located in a student-friendly environment, the facility is equipped with modern computing systems, secure record-management infrastructure, and digital processing capabilities. The branch ensures a streamlined and technology-enabled experience for students, contributing to the smooth functioning of academic processes. As an integral part of the college's administrative infrastructure, it reflects the institution's commitment to efficiency, transparency, and student convenience.

The laboratory is equipped with advanced instrumentation such as PCR systems, a UV-Visible Spectrophotometer, an Agarose Gel Electrophoresis Unit, a Cooling Centrifuge, and a Laminar Air Flow Chamber. It also includes specialized facilities like BOD incubators, temperature-controlled shakers and ovens, a double distillation unit, refrigeration systems, and precision analytical equipment. This facility supports research activities in molecular biology, microbiology, biotechnology, environmental science, and interdisciplinary domains. Dedicated culture and experimental areas enable students to develop practical skills, undertake innovative projects, and gain valuable early research experience.

BEST PRACTICES @ SSNC

Saghan Vann

The whole campus has rich plant diversity with a blend of important and valuable trees, herbs, and shrubs. One acre land in the old campus is devoted for the development of “Saghan Vann” keeping the perspective that it will act as lungs in near future for all the adjoining areas and will help in purifying the air up to the radius of 3 km in the vicinity of the college. A record of planting 1000 saplings in less than an hour was made to cultivate the same.

Botanical Garden

A separate area in the new campus is dedicated to Botanical Garden. The garden is full of beautiful flowers and fruit bearing plants. The garden has one small pond also which has both submerged and floating plants. It has wide utility for the students to understand the practical concepts of pond ecosystem in the paper of ecology and environment science.

Herbal Garden

The herbal garden in the old campus was inaugurated on 24 April 2023, which has variety of useful herbs such as tulsi, aloe vera, cardamom, heart leaved moonseed (giloy) etc.

Solar Power Plant

The college is equipped with an on-grid rooftop “Solar Power Plant” of capacity 50 KW to fulfill the target of renewable solar energy potential under national solar mission. The solar power plant was inaugurated on 24th Nov. 2020. After installation of the solar power plant, the cost of expenditure on electricity bill is reduced by one fourth.

BEST PRACTICES @ SSNC

Paper Recycling

For recycling the wastepaper SSNC coordinates with the NGO Jaagruti for which a letter of appreciation is given by the same when wastepaper is collected by it to be recycled. It collects wastepaper and provides usable A4 size paper in exchange for this. This practice helps in reducing solid waste in a sustainable manner.

Composting Unit

A composting unit is made in the botanical garden to decompose the garden waste. The compost prepared is further used in gardening.

Water Conservation

The open two third area of the campus helps in recharging the groundwater. A rainwater harvesting tank is made in the lawn for collecting rainwater. Waste RO water is used for gardening. Water meter is installed to monitor the usage of water.

SYNTRIA: THE LIFE SCIENCES SOCIETY



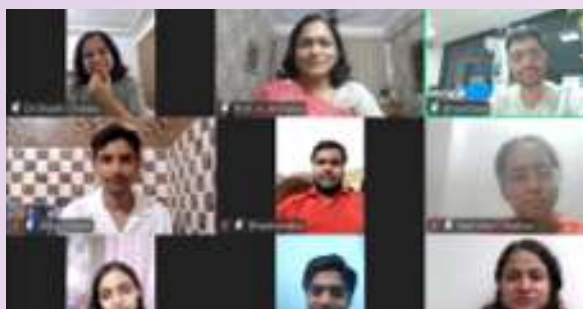

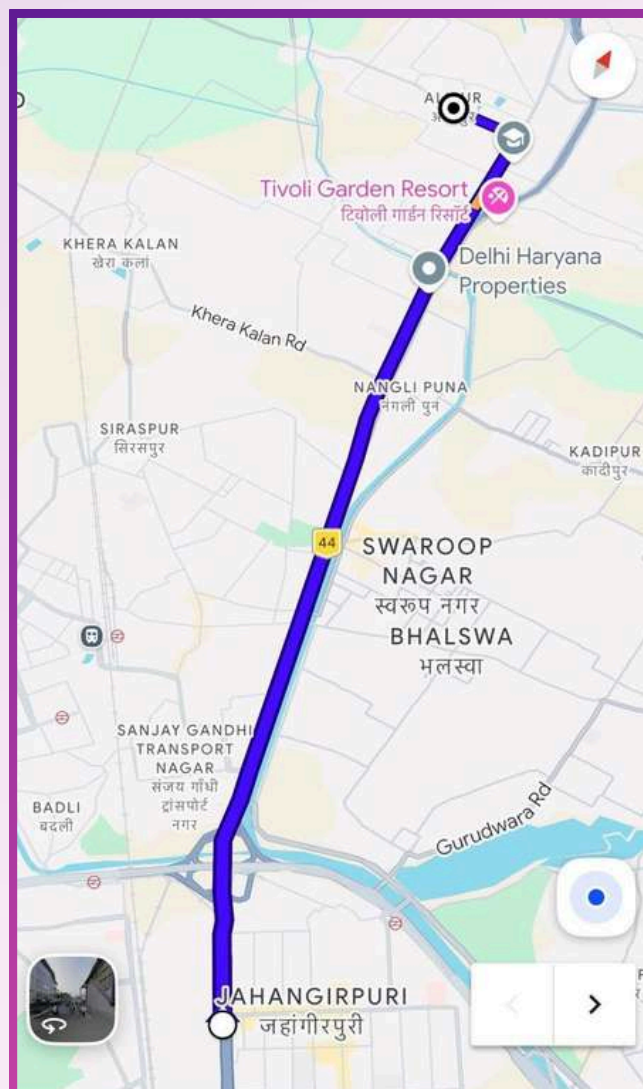

TRANSPORT CONNECTIVITY

Swami Shraddhanand College is well connected through an extensive and efficient public transport network, ensuring easy accessibility for students, faculty, and visitors.

The college is served by a number of Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC) bus routes operating to and from Alipur, including bus numbers 103, 109, 112, 120, 124, 125, 129, 131, 135, 136, 144, 148, 149, 154, 171, 175, 193, and 882. In addition, frequent bus services are available from major transit points such as Jahangir Puri and Azadpur, making the campus conveniently reachable from different parts of the city.



The nearest metro station to the college is Jahangir Puri Metro Station on the Yellow Line of the Delhi Metro, which provides a convenient and reliable mode of travel for students commuting from Delhi and the National Capital Region. To further facilitate student mobility, the college also has a dedicated **U-Special bus service** for Swami Shraddhanand College students.

- This service departs from Jahangir Puri Metro Station at 8:20 a.m. and brings students directly to the college campus.
- In the afternoon, the bus leaves the college at 3:30 p.m. and drops students back at Jahangir Puri Metro Station. This dedicated service adds to the ease, safety, and convenience of daily commuting for students.
