He serves as a member of several important committees of the Government of India such as the Scientific Advisory Committee to the Cabinet, on the senate of the Academy of Scientific & Innovative Research, the Steering Committees on Science & Technology and Higher & Technical Education, Planning Commission of India as well as a member of the Board of Governors of IIT Mumbai and as Chairman, Executive Committee of National Science Centre, Delhi. He is President Elect (Mathematical Sciences) of the Indian Science Congress Association in its centenary year and is also a member of the Governing Council of All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi. He is on the Boards, Executive Councils and Committees of many universities, professional bodies and institutions such as the UGC, Indian Science Congress Association, Centre for Mathematical Modeling & Computer Simulation, Bangalore; Committee of Central Advisory Board of Education (CABE) on University Reforms, National Board of Higher Mathematics etc. He has served as the chairman, Institute of Informatics & Communication from 2003 – 2005. At the international level too, Prof. Singh has been involved in many organizations promoting mathematical research and education. He has been the member of the Executive Organizing Committee of the International Congress of Mathematicians, 2010. In his capacity as visiting professor, he has lectured at various universities in the USA, Canada, Egypt, Australia and Europe. He is a graduate from St. Stephen's College, University of Delhi from where he also received his Masters and M. Phil degrees. He obtained his Ph.D. degree from the Imperial College of Science, Technology and Medicine, London. His area of specialization is Functional Analysis, Operator Theory, Harmonic Analysis on which he has published extensively

in national and international journals of high repute and has been awarded for his academic achievements. He has reviewed the refereed papers for several publications in India and abroad including the Mathematical Reviews. His contribution to the quality and effectiveness in furthering education and research has been widely acknowledged.

Prof. Singh has received prizes and honours for his academic achievements and takes an avid interest in literature (English and Hindi) and painting. His published article in hindi on the life of Evariste Galois has been widely acclaimed. He is a student of Gandhian philosophy.

On behalf of the Governing body, staff and students, I express my sincere appreciation and gratitude to Prof. Dinesh Singh for accepting our invitation to be the chief guest and grace the function. We welcome you, Sir.

Our other distinguished guest, Sh. Jaswant Singh Rana, is a well-known social activist of this area, who has worked extensively at the grass-root level. He did his Ph.D. from Central Drug Research Institute, Lucknow, UP/KU Nainital. He did his post doctoral work at Indiana University, Bloomington and Purdue University, West Lafayette, USA. Prof. Rawat has published 55 research articles in national/international journals, got three US and three Indian patents to his credit. His work has been cited over 850 times with h-index 17. Prof. Rawat has co-authored a book entitled "**Bioactive Marine Natural Products**" and has written three book chapters. Prof. Rawat is an Associate Editor of Journal of the Indian Chemical Society and International Journal of Drug Discovery and also he is a member of international editorial board of many journals such as Marine Drugs, Anti-Cancer Agents in Medicinal Chemistry, The Open Catalysis Journal, Research and Reports in Medicinal Chemistry, Chemistry and Biology Interface etc. Prof. Rawat has worked as a Guest Editor of Anti-Cancer Agents in Medicinal Chemistry in 2008, and 2012. He is

a recipient of CRSI young researcher award (2007), Prof. D. P. Chakraborty 60th Birth Anniversary Commemoration Award (2007), and ISCB young scientist award (2010), VC's Pratik Chinha Samman, Kumaun University, Nainital (2011).
