The academic session 2025-2026 has been a year of remarkable academic productivity, professional growth, and institutional advancement for Swami Shraddhanand College. During this period, 12 teaching faculty members and 5 non-teaching staff members were promoted, strengthening academic leadership as well as administrative efficiency within the institution.

The college demonstrated a strong research culture with a total of 139 publications, including research articles, review papers, authored books, edited volumes, and book chapters published in reputed national and international journals and publishing houses. 





### Achievements of Administrative Staff

Swami Shraddhanand College has successfully implemented comprehensive computerization across its administrative and accounts departments, significantly enhancing the efficiency and transparency of staff- and student-related services. A robust e-governance framework has been established, including integration with the Government e-Marketplace and the adoption of E-Payment and E-Tendering systems. The computerized accounts infrastructure now enables employees to conveniently access salary statements, Provident Fund (PF) and National Pension System (NPS) details, Form 16, and information related to medical and Leave Travel Concession (LTC) benefits. In addition, the admission process for all undergraduate programmes has been fully digitized and is centrally administered by the University of Delhi. The successful implementation of these digital and administrative reforms has been made possible through the dedicated efforts of key personnel, including Dr. Dharam Veer Bhardwaj (Administrative Officer), Subhash (Section Officer – Administration), Neha Pruthi (Section Officer – Accounts), and Rahul Pathak (Senior P.A. to the Principal), along with other members of the administrative team.

### Examination Branch Report

The Examination Branch of Swami Shraddhanand College has significantly improved operational efficiency by streamlining digital processes related to paper option selection, examination form submission, and fee payment. Students are now able to conveniently access essential academic information including examination timetables, official notices, attendance records, and internal assessment marks through the college website, ensuring greater transparency and ease of communication.

These reforms were effectively led by Examination In-Charge Dr. Anil Kumar and Dr. Om Dutt, whose dedicated efforts played a key role in accelerating the modernization of examination-related systems. The smooth conduct of examinations was further supported by Dr. Seema Gupta, who

served as Coordinator for practical examinations and Deputy Superintendent for theory examinations, ensuring the efficient and orderly execution of the entire examination process.

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## **Infrastructure Development Report**

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The college is supported by modern infrastructure and comprehensive facilities that foster an effective environment for teaching, learning, and co-curricular engagement. The entire campus comprising academic blocks, library, staff and faculty rooms, classrooms, and the Principal's office is fully Wi-Fi enabled. Functioning across two campuses, the institution accommodates sixty-eight classrooms, twenty-six advanced laboratories, and two dedicated research laboratories, along with two seminar halls designed for academic and co-curricular programmes. The campus is inclusive and accessible, with the Enabling Unit providing specialized computer systems for students and faculty with special needs. Key developments during the past year include the creation of Saghan Van, installation of an on-campus ATM, and construction of a new academic block.

A spacious amphitheatre and the Bhartendu Rang Mandap, equipped with a green room, provide venues for cultural and creative activities. The college also features a multipurpose sports ground for Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Football, and Cricket, along with dedicated facilities for badminton and basketball. The campus is secured through comprehensive CCTV surveillance. Four fully equipped computer laboratories support academic work through advanced software such as Treecon, Phylip, Matlab, and Python. Additional student amenities include a medical room, girls' common room, canteen, and photocopying facility.

In keeping with its commitment to sustainability, the institution has adopted solar energy as its primary power source. Ongoing infrastructural expansion includes further development of the academic block, addition of new classrooms, upgrading of computer systems, and enhancement of academic and sports facilities. These initiatives reflect the college's continued dedication to academic excellence, sustainability, and efficient institutional growth in alignment with its vision and mission.

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## **College Library Report**

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The college library, automated with LIMS software, serves as the backbone of teaching and learning endeavor. With a diverse collection, advanced automation system and a commitment to embracing modern technologies, the library provides a conducive environment for both faculty and students.

1. It houses a rich collection of over 1,40,87 books, including sections dedicated to textbooks, general, references, periodicals and Braille materials.
2. The library has 27 newspapers (with multiple copies) and 24 magazines.

3. The users are issued barcode identity cards for streamlined check-in and check-out with borrowing limits for different categories.
4. A log book is kept at the entrance to keep a check on the footfall in the library.
5. The library utilizes SOUL 3.0 software for automation, featuring a web-based Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) for easy access to materials.
6. Access to more than 2 lakh e-books and 6000+ e-journals is provided through INFLIBNET NLIST Consortium, ONOS (One Nation One Subscription) and Delhi University Library System (DULS)
7. The library also caters to visually challenged students with assistive tools and a Braille collection. Future expansion plans include modern infrastructure and RFID system.
8. A display board displaying the latest books and periodicals have been set up in the reading room.
9. The library provides various facilities including reading room service on both the campuses circulation services including inter library loan services, reference and referral service and user guidance service/helpdesk.
10. The library has a regular subscription for e-resources like e-books, e-journals, e-database, e-shodh sindhu, e-shodh Ganga and remote access to e-resources.
11. Ms. Chinki (Semi Professional Assistant) participated in 1 week training program in Centre Reference Library (University of Delhi) on 21<sup>st</sup> April 2025 and 24<sup>th</sup> Nov. 2025.

## STAFF COUNCIL COMMITTEES

### ACADEMIC ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Academic Advisory Committee, under the able convenorship of Dr. Sakshi Agrawal and comprising Prof. Daljit Singh, Dr. R. N. Srivastava, Dr. A. K. Dubey, Dr. Pankaj Lakhera, Dr. L.B. Swarnkar, Dr. Gopal Lal Meena, Dr. Chetna Sharma, and Dr. Anjali Saini as esteemed members, played a pivotal role in strengthening academic support mechanisms for students during the academic session 2025-26. The committee proactively addressed student concerns related to the implementation of the new curriculum pattern, ensured the smooth and systematic conduct of fourth-year research presentations, and facilitated close coordination with academic departments to maintain the seamless delivery of regular classes. Furthermore, the committee actively encouraged departments to organize workshops, expert talks, guest lectures, and industrial visits, thereby fostering experiential learning and effectively bridging the gap between classroom instruction and industry expectations.

### ADD-ON COURSE COMMITTEE

The 30-hour Add-on Course on Career in Law and Personality Development was conducted from 5 February to 13 February 2026 in hybrid mode, under the guidance of Prof. Gauri Mishra and coordinated by Dr. Nitin Mishra and Dr. Brijender Dhaiya, with full support from the committee members. The course aimed to provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the legal profession while promoting holistic personality development. It introduced various career opportunities in law, offered practical knowledge of the legal system, and focused on developing key skills such as communication, confidence, leadership, decision-making, critical thinking, and professional ethics. Adopting an interactive and learner-centric approach, the program successfully bridged the gap between academic knowledge and professional preparedness, equipping students with both theoretical insight and practical exposure to meet future academic and professional challenges.



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## ALUMNI COMMITTEE

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The Alumni Committee, led by Prof. A. Archana along with Prof. Namrata, Prof. Preeti Sachar, Dr. Ranjan Kumar, Dr. Akanksha Gupta, and Dr. Aanchal Sethi, organized several alumni interaction sessions to motivate students and provide guidance for their future. The notable sessions are:

1. On 17 April 2025, Mr. Abhishek Mishra, alumnus of Geography (2017-2020) and expert in Geo-information Science and Disaster Risk Reduction, shared his experiences in planning, management, and sustainable development, providing insights into careers in social sciences and international opportunities.
2. On 17 April 2025, Dr. Lokesh Rana, alumnus of Physics (2007-2010) and assistant professor at Zakir Husain Delhi College, discussed his research in sensor fabrication, higher studies, international scholarships, and shared valuable guidance for career planning with students.
3. On 28 January 2026, Mr. Abhishek Vardhan Singh, alumnus of History (2017-2020) and founder of Calligraphy Foundation, delivered a lecture on history, calligraphy, and epigraphy, highlighting his publications and contributions to curriculum design; the session was attended by over 100 students and faculty members.
4. On 28 January 2026, Mr. Karthik Prashant, alumnus of Microbiology (2021-2024), delivered an engaging talk for over 100 students. He shared his strategy for cracking entrance exams, including securing All India Rank 1 in CUET for Microbiology. Karthik is currently pursuing research at the National Centre for Biological Sciences (NCBS), affiliated with Tata Institute of Fundamental Research (TIFR), Mumbai



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## ART FOUNDATION COMMITTEE

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The Art Foundation Committee organized Art Festival 2025 on 9 October 2025 at the College Amphitheatre from 10:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., based on the theme “भारत संस्कृति, कला एवं उत्सव का संगम.” The festival was convened by Prof. Pradeep Kumar and successfully organised by the Art Foundation Committee. 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## ECO-CLUB

1. 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## ENABLING UNIT

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The Enabling Unit, coordinated by Prof. Pankaj Lakhera along with faculty members, Dr. Yamini Malhotra, Dr. Purva Mittal, Dr. Nitin Mishra, Dr. Bijay Kumar Pradhan, and Mr. Manish Sharma, functioned actively during the academic year 2025-26 to support students and staff with physical and visual disabilities. The Unit ensured effective implementation and maintenance of accessible infrastructure such as ramps, tactile paths, handrails, lifts, and disabled-friendly toilets. It played a crucial role in promoting an inclusive academic environment by facilitating equal access to institutional facilities. The Unit provided academic support through scanning and digitising textbooks and supplying study material in accessible formats for visually challenged students. Regular monitoring of facilities was undertaken, and issues were promptly communicated to the college authorities. Several major accessibility initiatives had already been completed before the NAAC visit of 2024. A formal meeting was held on 8 October 2025 to review progress and plan future activities. The Unit remained committed to inclusivity through infrastructure support, academic assistance, and awareness initiatives aligned with NEP 2020.

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## FEE CONCESSION COMMITTEE

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The Fee Concession Committee, coordinated by Dr. Saraswati Kanodia along with Prof. Mukesh Rana, Prof. Kamlesh Sareen, Dr. Devender Kumar, Dr. Govindji Rai, Dr. Narbir Singh, Dr. Aanchal Sethi, Dr. Partibha, Dr. Rajveer Yadav, Dr. Subhash Upadhyay, and Dr. Ram Singh Meena, works to provide financial support to deserving students, particularly from economically weaker



sections. During the academic year 2025-26, the committee held five meetings to review applications. A notice was displayed on the College website on 10 October 2025 inviting applications for fee concession, with the deadline extended from 30 October to 7 November 2025. Out of 89 applications received, 34 were shortlisted for fee concession based on family income of one lakh or less. Additionally, 79 applications for scholarships under various categories on the NSP Portal and e-District Delhi Portal were verified by the committee

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## **GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE FOR SC/ST/OBC/PWD & EWS**

The committee participated in both online and offline admissions, with the convener included in the core admission group for physical verification of certificates at the University Sports Ground, ensuring that all student concerns were efficiently resolved.



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## **HAR GHAR DHYAN COMMITTEE**


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The Har Ghar Dhyan Committee, comprising Dr. Lakshna Mahajan (Convener) and faculty members, conducted the following activities during 2025-26:

1. A Faculty Orientation Program on “Stress-Free Teaching” was held on 31 October 2025 in the Seminar Hall, New Building, SSNC. Around 65 faculty members participated and were

guided through relaxation techniques, pranayama, meditation, and yog nidra by trainers from the Art of Living Foundation. Certificates of participation were awarded.

2. An Orientation Program for first-year students of Science, Commerce, and Humanities was conducted in four sessions on 1 and 3 September 2025. More than 70 students learned meditation, Sudarshan Kriya, and breathing techniques to improve concentration and reduce stress.



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## PLACEMENT CELL

Delivered by Dr. Rajeswari Saha, the session highlighted the importance of communication skills, confidence, and adaptability for career success. It also emphasized personal branding, encouraging students to build a professional and authentic image both online and offline. The session addressed emerging industry trends, particularly the impact of artificial intelligence, and stressed the need for continuous skill development. Overall, the session motivated students to enhance both technical and soft skills to become job-ready and competitive.

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### **PURCHASE COMMITTEE**

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During the academic year 2025-26, the College Purchase Committee played a key role in ensuring systematic, transparent, and timely procurement to meet the academic and administrative needs of the college. Functioning in accordance with the General Financial Rules, University of Delhi guidelines, and internal financial norms, the Committee reviewed purchase proposals from departments, the library, laboratories, and offices. 

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## WELLNESS & MENTAL HEALTH COMMITTEE

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The Mental Health Committee of Swami Shraddhanand College organized a workshop on the topic “Depression Awareness and Support” on 03 February 2026. Dr. Chetana Sharma welcomed all the guests and speakers. The session was inaugurated by the Principal, Prof. Parveen Garg, with the ceremonial lighting of the lamp, followed by the DU Anthem. In his address, Prof. Parveen Garg stated that 20-30 years ago, mental health diseases were rarely observed or discussed in society but nowadays, mental health issues have become very common, even among younger people. Dr. Anusha Garg, the invited speaker for the workshop, highlighted that the number of people suffering from mental disorders has risen significantly over the years. She explained that mental health disorders are more prevalent among women (20%) than men (10%). Women in India are particularly more prone to conditions such as depression, anxiety, and somatic complaints compared to their male counterparts. She further discussed that in the very early stages, symptoms such as memory loss, irritability, loneliness, and suicidal thoughts can be observed in patients. However, with proper medical observation and timely treatment, patients can definitely recover within a short period. During the workshop, around 20 teachers and 81 students from various departments of Swami Shraddhanand College were present.



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## WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL


## NCC UNIT- 1 DELHI BATTALION (ARMD)


